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Board of Education to Consider Resolution to Maintain Flexibility in High School Graduation Test Requirement



At their meeting on June 7, 2016, the Board of Education discussed a resolution to encourage the New Jersey State Board of Education to maintain the current option for students to satisfy the High School Test Requirement through one of several assessment options.

Currently, high school students may satisfy the test requirement through one of the options below:

Language Arts

One of these PARCC assessments:
PARCC ELA Grade 9 - score of 750 or above
PARCC ELA Grade 10 - score of 750 or above
PARCC ELA Grade 11 - score of 725 or above

SAT Reading - score of 400 or above

ACT Reading - score of 16 or above

Accuplacer Write Placer - score of 6 or above

PSAT Reading or PSAT/NMSQT Reading - score of 22 or above

ACT Aspire Reading - score of 422 or above

ASVAB-AFQT Composite - score of 31 or above

Mathematics

One of these PARCC assessments:
PARCC Algebra I - score of 750 or above
PARCC Geometry - score of 725 or above
PARCC Algebra II - score of 725 or above

SAT Math - score of 400 or above

ACT Math - score of 16 or above

Accuplacer Elementary Algebra - score of 76 or above

PSAT Math or PSAT/NMSQT Math - score of 22 or above

ACT Aspire Math - score of 422 or above

ASVAB-AFQT Composite - score of 31 or above

The New Jersey State Board of Education is considering revised High School Graduation Requirements which would require students, beginning with the Class of 2021 (our current 7th grade students), to pass the PARCC ELA 10 and the PARCC Algebra assessments in order to graduate.

A resolution will be included on the agenda for the June 21st meeting of the Montville Board of Education. If passed, the district will join more than a dozen other districts in the state who have called upon the New Jersey State Board of Education to provide students with multiple pathways to satisfy the NJ High School Graduation Requirements by maintaining testing options similar to those that are currently in place. This flexibility would enable students to choose alternate assessments to the PARCC.



NJ Department of Education Seeks Input on School Performance Reports

The New Jersey Department of Education is asking for your input into the kind of public school information that you would like reported annually. This is your opportunity to tell the state exactly what you want to see in the School Performance Reports (formerly called the School Report Cards) to ensure that you have access to information that can help you determine the quality of your local public schools.

You are asked to spend approximately five minutes to [complete the survey](#) by way of the link below. The survey is entirely voluntary and anonymous. It will only ask for general demographic and school information so the Department of Education can ensure it is getting a representative sample from all parts of the state.
