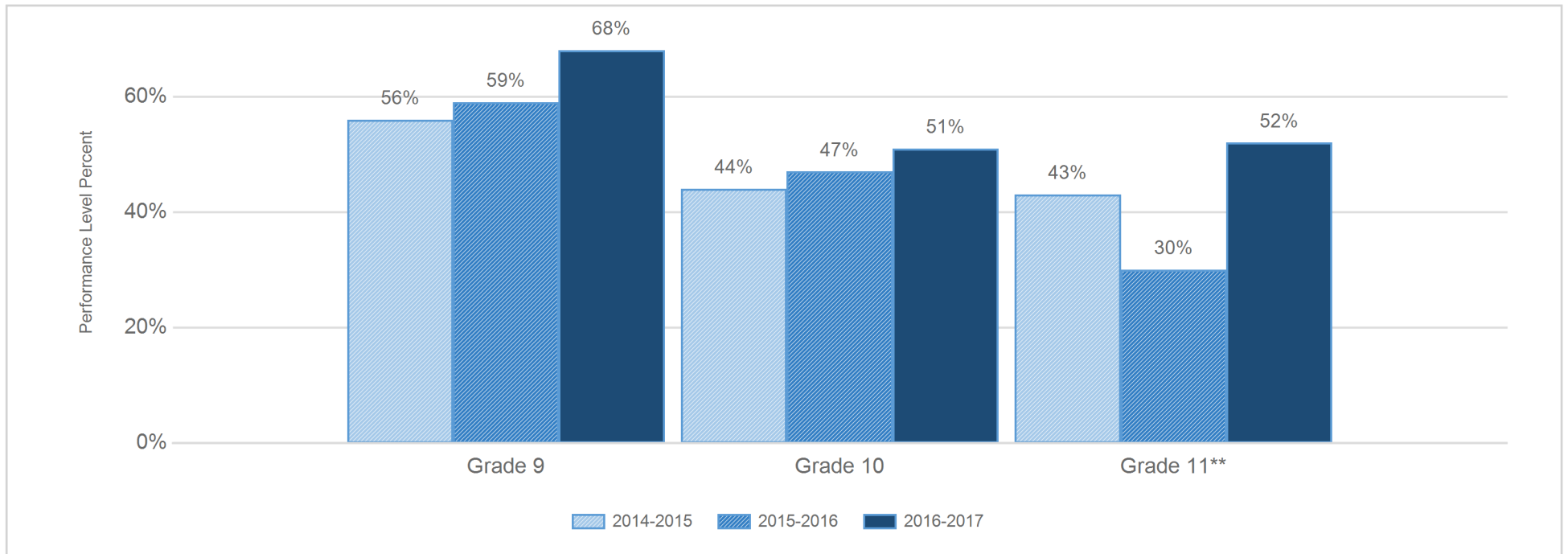

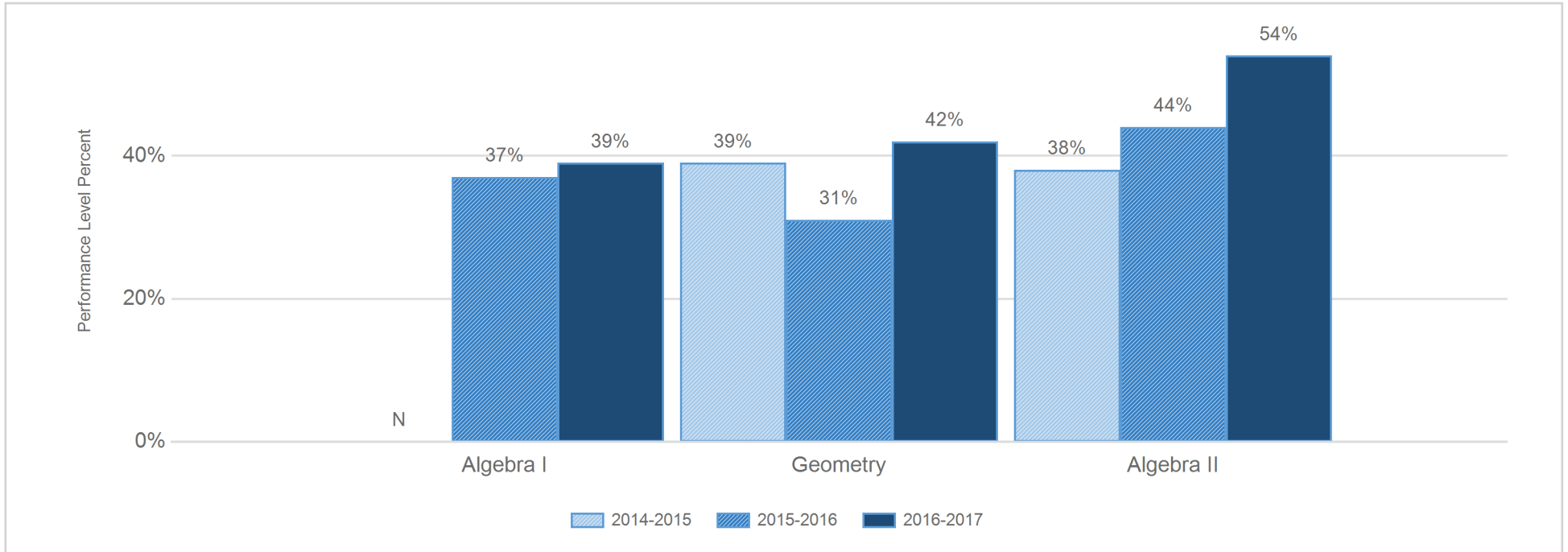


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Mathematics Assessment – Performance Trends

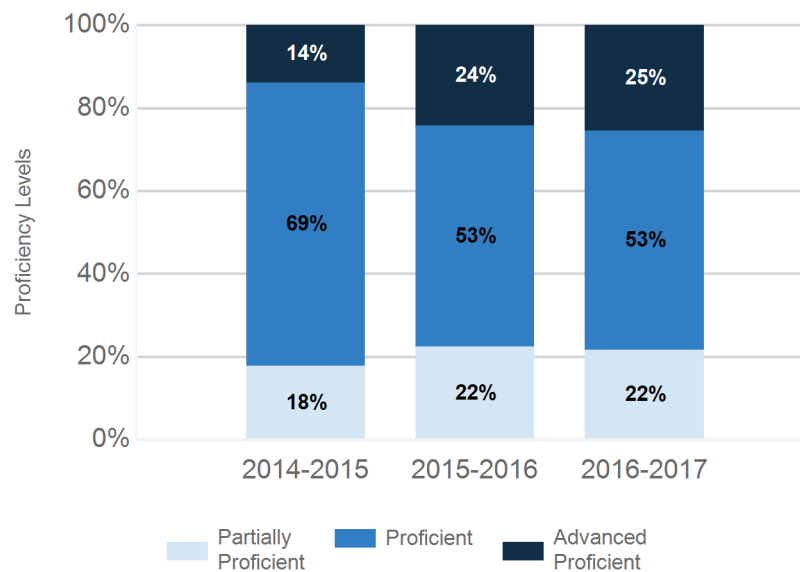

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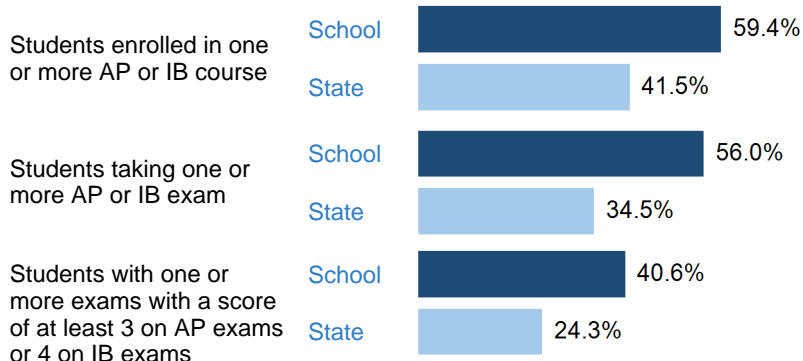

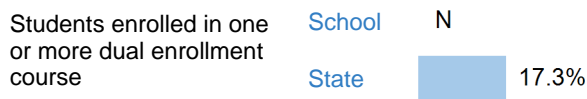

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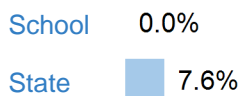

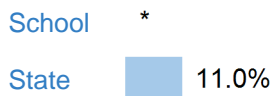
CTE Participants

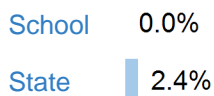

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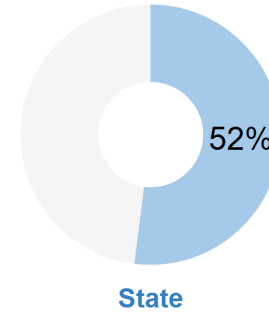
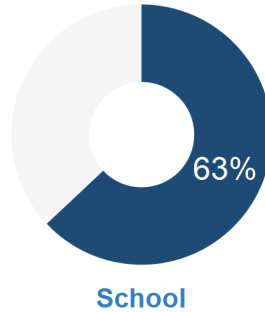

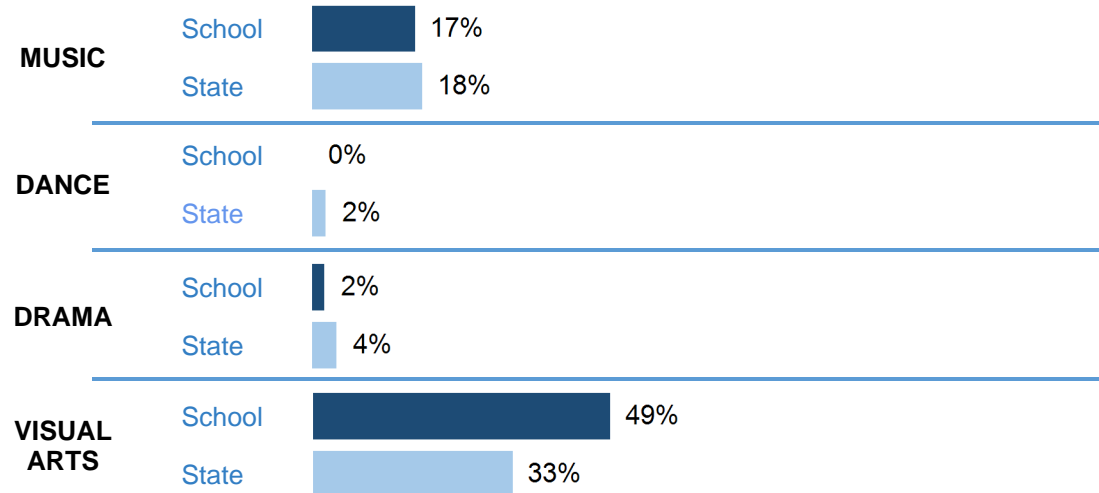

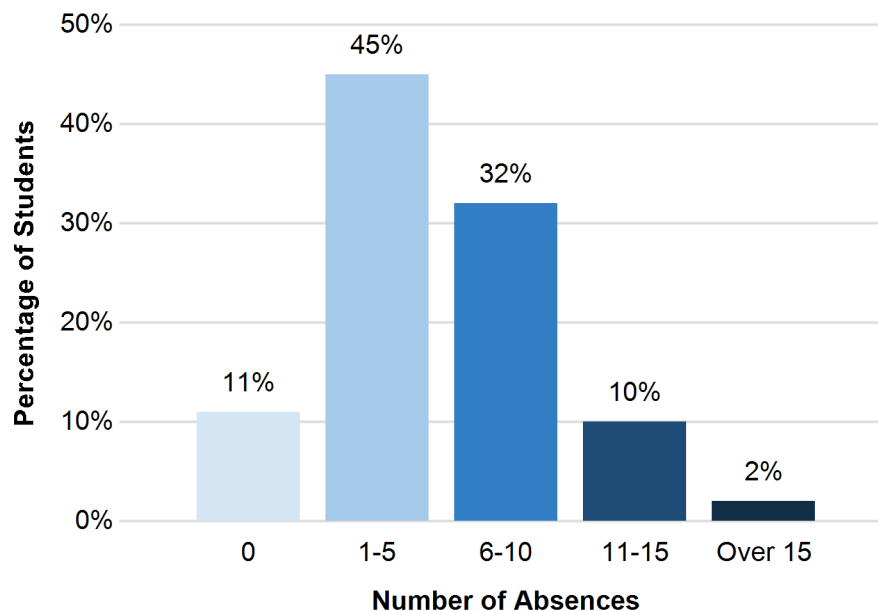

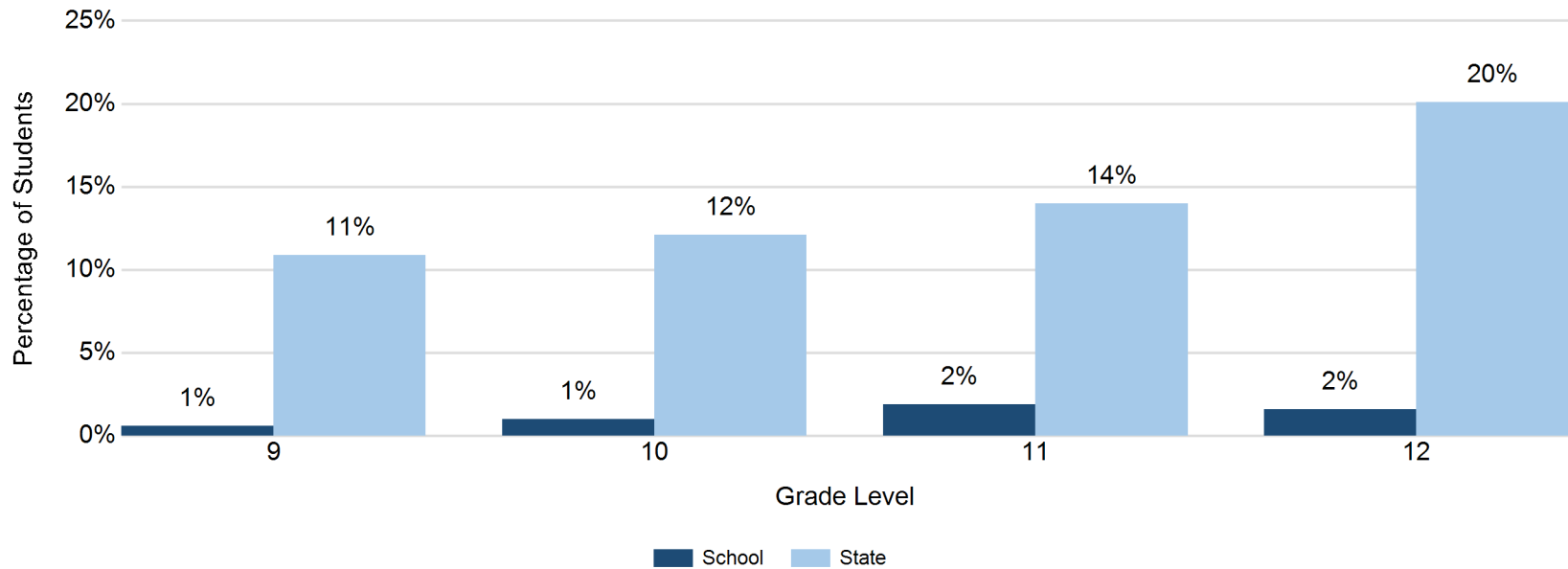
