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Montville Township Public Schools Prepares for 2021-2022 School Year



Based on direction shared by Governor Murphy in April, the Montville Township Public Schools are planning for a full day of in-person instruction at all grade levels for the 2021-2022 school year. It is our understanding that guidance for the 2021-2022 school year is currently being prepared by the New Jersey Department of Education. We await this information to determine if there will be any changes to our current practices and protocols in our schools and classrooms. We also await clarification regarding the standards to be used for those students who may have a medical condition that may not permit them to attend school in person.

The district is also reviewing the plans for the MEDLC program in 2021-2022. Additional details about MEDLC parameters and registration procedures will be forthcoming in May.

NJSLA Administration Cancelled for Spring 2021 - Students to be Assessed in Fall 2021 Using Start Strong Test

The USDOE has approved the waiver request submitted by the New Jersey Department of Education regarding the spring administration of the New Jersey Student Learning Assessments. In April, the USDOE indicated that the NJSLA administration may be cancelled and replaced with the Start Strong assessment which will be administered to students in the fall of



2021. Details about the assessment and the administration schedule will be provided in the fall. The Start Strong assessment is a shorter test than the NJSLA. It will test student mastery of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science.



Schoology As An Important Communication Tool

Parents are reminded that Schoology (the District's Learning Management System) remains one of our primary vehicles for communicating important information to parents and students. Principals use the platform to send updates about school activities as well as to communicate critical information, such as the reporting of the identification of positive COVID-19

cases.

Schoology has a useful app that will allow you to receive updates and access information about your child's courses, etc. Parents are encouraged to install the app. You can find the Schoology app in the Apple App Store or on Google Play.
