Good News & Progress in Our Schools:

- William Mason - The students in Mrs. Oberlin's Kindergarten Class have been learning about fire safety! We read several books and poems about fire safety rules. After reading Stop, Drop and Roll by Margery Cuyler, we discussed this rule and decided to act out! We put a fake fire flame on our shirt. Then we *stopped, dropped, covered* our face with our hands and *rolled!* We also made Dalmatian dog fire hats after reading Dot the Fire Dog by Lisa Desimini. We counted dots on Dalmatians for our math homework. We loved having the Montville Fire Department come to our school and review all the rules with us! We even got to take a picture by the big fire truck! It was an exciting week!
- William Mason - Mrs. Shell's first grade class is having fun exploring sound energy in our new science curriculum. We made our own instruments to discover sound through vibrations and used pitch forks to discover sound waves in water.
- William Mason- Participated in Week of Respect. We had spirit days, learned about the importance of kindness, as well as problem solving strategies.
- William Mason - The 5th grade Kid's Care Club is off to a great start! Students are helping out with morning announcements, special programs, as well as in lunch bunch with the younger students.
- William Mason - The student's council is collecting new and gently used small stuffed animals for hurricane victims in Puerto Rico. All donations will be given to the New Jersey -1 Disaster Medical Assistance Team who will be distributing the stuffed animals to children while they are receiving care at various medical centers. We are collecting donations in the main hallway until Friday, October 20th.
- William Mason - In Mrs. Stephenson's Second Grade the students have been using "Flexible Seating". Every morning, they pick their best working place. They can choose a bean bag, stadium chair, rocking chair, standing desk, pouf on the carpet and many more options. Using a set of expectations and rules, we have found this environment to be conducive to different learning styles and fun.
- William Mason - Mrs. Stella's 4th graders have been excited to use Kahoot as a way to review information they learned. The online quiz game allows them to all participate at the same time and test their knowledge of the given subject area. They see if they are answering correctly and are getting information for the upcoming test in a fun way if they were incorrect.
- William Mason - Mrs. Stella's 4th graders have been completing many activities and experiments with our new Inspire Science book. We are learning about energy and its relation to speed, force and other variables.
- Hilldale - During the week of October 23-27, students and staff at Hilldale celebrated Red Ribbon Week. Each day was a different theme day to participate in, such as "I'm too smart to start", where everyone wore their favorite College or Hilldale shirt. During Character Education lessons for the week, Kindergarten and First Grade students focused on being healthy, Second and Third Grade students focused on the importance of making good decisions and Fourth and Fifth Grade focused on peer pressure and the dangers of drugs. Students were given goodies to bring home to celebrate the week and announcements were made to promote health and wellness.
- Valley View - Students in Grades K – 2 enjoyed a Halloween Safety and Anti-Bullying Assembly presented by Officer Scott McGowan of the Montville Township Police Department. Officer McGowan, a wonderful role model, has an incredible way with the children and delivered many important messages. To conclude the assembly, Officer McGowan had all of the

students stand and recite a powerful Anti-Bullying Pledge that encouraged them to stand up to bullies for themselves and their friends.

- Valley View - The Dare to Care Club completed their *Promoting Acts of Kindness* video this week. The club of 10 girls each donated 8-10 inches of hair at local salons. The hair will be used to make wigs for girls and women who've lost their hair due to cancer treatment. The video is now posted on the Valley View website.
- Valley View - Children in Ms. Sullivan's third grade classroom are working on a video promoting bus safety under the direction of Mr. Saunders and Mr. Spector. Children will role play both inappropriate and appropriate behaviors while a bus is in motion and proper safety precautions when entering and exiting a bus. Bullying on the bus will be a focal point of the video.
- Valley View - Dr. Kennedy and Mr. Spector met with Kathleen McClay, consultant with the United Way and Youth Empowerment Alliance, to discuss ideas promoting a bully free learning environment at Valley View this school year.
- Valley View - The NY Jets Upstanders of the Week for the week of 10/23-10/27 are fourth grader Diego Naranjo of Ms. Gearing's class and second grader Yunji Zhang from Mrs. Trevaskiss's class. The two display excellent behavior and self-control in class and offer to help their respective classmates whenever they can.
- Valley View - Mrs. Slattery, Mrs. Trevaskiss, and Miss Romanski/Miss Katz's classes created Pumpkin Book Characters. Students read a book of their choosing and designed a pumpkin to look like a character from their book. They also wrote a book report summarizing their stories. The pumpkin book characters are on display in our Media Center!
- Valley View - Ms. Caravello and Ms. Streep's class launched their first Lego Learning project this year. The students worked hard to recreate towns in NJ during their study of NJ and NJ regions. Their projects were a success and the parents were thrilled to see learning in practice.
- Valley View - Wow! Another month of learning! It seems like October has just flown by, thinking back on all the books we explored and strategies we learned in order to be good readers! We are also more than halfway done with our lowercase letters and are starting to put words into our drawings. As great mathematicians, we have already learned to compare and order numbers 0 to 5. We finished up the month by doing a STEAM experiment in which we predicted and discovered what would happen when we put a piece of candy corn in different solutions. Oh, dressing up for the Halloween parade and parade was quite fun as well!
- Valley View - Students in Mrs. Handschuch's Preschool PM Class recently utilized their problem solving and critical thinking skills to participate in a team STEM challenge to construct a spider web. After listening to the story of *The Very Busy Spider* by Eric Carle, teams were provided with various unconventional materials to construct their spider webs. Teams used iPads to view and research different spider webs. Students collaborated with peers on design and construction challenges. The children also presented and discussed their projects to the class.
- Cedar Hill - Jack Trehwella, a Cedar Hill student in Miss Walden's third grade class volunteered his time on Columbus Day to help paint rocks, 100 to be exact, for OneMontville. Jack is our youngest volunteer to date and he has given his time on many occasions to help support the organization. We brought the rocks to the 150th Celebration Day and asked everyone who stopped by the OneMontville tent to write a message of peace, love and respect on a rock, take it and place it where someone will find it. It just may brighten that person's day. Jack wants to make a difference in the world. He represented what Cedar Hill School is all about.
- Cedar Hill - In preparation of our very special Veterans Day celebration, all students at Cedar Hill, from Pre-K to Fifth grade made a different patriotic themed art project in the art room. Each lesson was preceded with an explanation of what the holiday is all about and time for Q and A. The students made and shared many personal connections that added relevance and meaning to our discussions. Our hallways look beautiful, welcoming and full of gratitude to honor those who deserve it the most! Always remember to thank a Veteran!
- Woodmont - Celebrated a Fourth Grade Family Math Day on Wednesday October 18, 2017. Fourth grade teachers facilitated activities between parent and students that reinforced 21st Century math skills. Thanks to Margaret Beatty, Victoria Carlucci, Tina Janis and Norma Murawski for organizing the event. Special thanks to the Woodmont PTA for sponsoring the activity.
- Woodmont - Congratulations to Fourth grade teachers Margaret Beatty and Tina Janis who will present at this year's NJEA convention on their HIPP grant: Brick by Brick.
- Woodmont - Congratulations to Woodmont's October Students of the Month Kindergarten: Joanna Manaparambril, First grade: Sami Naqvi, Second Grade: Akithmi Kankanamge, Third Fourth: Husain Tinwala, Fourth Grade: Chanel DeSimone and Fifth Grade: Ismael Matari.
- MTHS - This past Saturday (October 14), the MTHS Marching Band competed in the Yamaha Cup at Met Life Stadium. We are thrilled to report that the Marching Band placed 5th out of 14 bands, and received a Caption Award for Best Visual. After the Yamaha Cup, the Marching Band took 1st Place in the North Warren Band Competition. At the North Warren competition, the Marching Band received Caption Awards for Best Color Guard, Music, Visual, Overall Effect, and Best in Show after receiving the highest score among all competing bands. The entire MTHS Community is proud of all members of Marching Band and Color Guard, and wishes them continued success this season!

- MTHS -Congratulations to the MTHS Marching Band for finishing 3rd out of 15 bands at the New Jersey State Championship held this past Saturday(November 4th) in Middletown NJ. In addition to placing 3rd the band received the caption award for “best overall effect.” On Sunday, the band competed in the A Class National Championship at J. Birney Crum Stadium in Allentown, PA, placing 5th overall out of 21 bands. Congratulations to the marching band students, director, staff, and parents on another outstanding season!
- Lazar - At the New Jersey School Boards Association Fall Workshop held in Atlantic City on October 23-26, 2017, the Robert R. Lazar Middle School was recognized for achieving Bronze Level Status through the Sustainable Jersey for Schools Program. Sustainable Jersey for Schools is a certification program for New Jersey public schools that want to go green, conserve resources and take steps to create a brighter future. Sustainable Jersey is a prestigious designation that is earned through undertaking a number of sustainable actions which include policy development, assessment activities such as energy audits, school projects and curriculum activities.
- Lazar - The first 6th grade Color War took place on Friday, October 6th, and it was a huge success! Students came to school dressed from head to toe in their team colors and the energy was palpable throughout the building. Everyone participated in friendly competitions and team building activities on the fields across the street from Lazar including backwards kickball, beach ball, hula hoop, and sponge relays, Steal the Thunder, ping pong carry, double ball soccer, basketball and ending with the ever popular tug of war. Points were kept and the 6 White Team was declared the winner. A great day was had by all and we're looking forward to making this event a 6th grade tradition!
- Lazar - Week of Respect commenced our Random Acts of Kindness Program. Each marking period Lazar Middle School teachers and staff recognize students for their kind efforts in school to assist their peers and teachers. The program, Random Acts of Kindness, has been running for over 6 years. Students are honored with certificates and a reward from the school counseling department. The Random Acts of Kindness program accompanies our character education program entitled “PERCC” to infuse Pride, Empathy, Respect, Cooperation and Citizenship into our daily routines at school. We are very proud of our students and their kindness towards each other.
- Lazar - To kick off Red Ribbon Week this year at Lazar, all homerooms were provided on Monday with the history of this campaign by Student Assistance Counselor, Kelly McCorkle. This was done in an attempt to ensure that all students had a full understanding of why we would be celebrating it. Short videos were shown in homeroom on Tuesday and Thursday: a singer/songwriter talks about how addiction has affected her life and how she pursues her natural high. An NBA basketball star talks about how it's not about being popular, it's about making a name for yourself. On Wednesday, Mrs. McCorkle was in the cafeteria during all lunch periods giving the students the opportunity to identify their own personal natural high and displaying it on a bulletin board amongst their peers. Friday all faculty and staff were encouraged to wear red to show their support. The week turned out extremely successful.
- Lazar - Cheryl Zanone and Matt Myers of Robert R. Lazar Middle School participated in New Jersey Science Teachers Association's 2017 Maitland P. Simmons (MPS) Memorial Award Summer Institute. Myers was one of 18 science teachers selected from middle school applicants throughout the state of New Jersey to participate in the 5-day program entitled "21st Century Science connections: Real World Applications for the Classroom". Zanone administered and arranged the program which was held at the College of Saint Elizabeth, Morristown from July 17-21, 2017. The program included a field experience at Meadowlands Environmental Center during which educators engaged in activities and demonstrations modeling integration of engineering into their lesson units. Teachers were prompted to consider how each activity could be used in their classroom within the scope and sequence of a Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) unit. They gained skills necessary to select appropriate Anchor Phenomena through which lessons could be developed, utilizing Science and Engineering Practices as well as Cross Cutting Concepts. While building upon shared ideas and collaborating with colleagues, this year's remarkable Simmons Scholars had an opportunity to think deeply and create lessons which represent the dimensional mindset at the core of the NGSS. Simmons Scholars are also offered a one-day admission to the New Jersey Science Convention which both of our Lazar educators attended in October.
- Lazar- The students participated enthusiastically in the annual Scholastic Book Fair held during the week of October 16th. Aply chaired by Joanne Lang and Grace Sumka, students did their part to increase their own personal libraries, while helping Mrs. Metz, school librarian, acquire the exciting new books that students will be searching for this fall! The wide assortment of popular paperbacks and hardcovers got the buzz going, getting students talking and sharing ideas about what they wanted to take home and start reading. As in the past, the PTC has generously donated the proceeds from this year's sale to the library in order to purchase new books. Thank you to Mrs. Lang, Mrs. Sumka, and the many other volunteers who helped to make this year's sale a success!
- Lazar - About a month ago, Lazar students were taken outside for trial recess, during lunch periods. So far, it has been a big success! We gathered equipment such as corn hole, can jam, Frisbees and jump ropes from the gym. 3 parking spots next to the outdoor lunch tables are coned off by Jeff Simon in the morning on nice days. The games are set up by 4th period teachers on lunch duty and cleaned up by 7th period. The other equipment is used on the grass areas next to the tables. Students from each grade are typically given the opportunity to go out on alternating days, depending on the numbers. It is our hope that we may be able to purchase more equipment by the time spring weather rolls around, so that everyone may go

out each day, and have even more options to appeal to everyone! So many of the students have been enjoying a recess and no doubt benefitting from the health benefits! We are excited to watch this grow!

- Lazar - On Friday, October 20, 2017, The Nutrition, Family and Consumer Studies Department at Robert Lazar’s Middle School hosted their annual “Bus Drivers’ Breakfast”. All of Mrs. Jasterzbski’s sixth, seventh and eighth grade sections participated in some component of the program. Students were responsible for scheduling, menu planning, pricing, food preparation, service and clean up. Morning highlights involved presentations by the students to include a “Bus Drivers’ Pledge”, a breakfast buffet offering a wonderful assortment of student prepared foods, an international sampling table, and homemade favors. The event was personalized and heartwarming as students’ words and actions were a testament of their respect and appreciation for their bus drivers.
