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Montville Township Public Schools Virtual or Remote Instruction Plan

Approved by the Montville Township
Board of Education
September 14, 2021

As required by the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE), the Montville Township Public Schools approved a District Safe Return Plan for the 2021-2022 school year on June 15, 2021. This report has been posted to the district website and submitted to the NJDOE as required.

In addition to the Safe Return Plan, the NJDOE has required that all public school districts in New Jersey develop a plan for the delivery of virtual or remote instruction in accordance with N.J.S.A. This instruction is not something that parents can elect for their children as an option, but rather a means of maintaining instruction for those students who are required to quarantine due to being diagnosed with the virus or being identified as a close contact of a positive case by the Montville Township Public Schools or by the Montville Township Department of Health.

Virtual or Remote Instruction

All district students have been issued a Chromebook and a power cord. This device will permit a student to log into their class virtually should they meet the quarantine parameters set forth above. Student must log in and be virtually present for all of their assigned classes. Device cameras must be on during all classes to enable the teacher to observe the student. Students will be expected to participate in all virtual classroom meetings and to complete all online assignments as directed by their teacher.

Any parents who do not have Internet access available in their home at the time their child is required to be quarantined, should contact the Technology Department regarding assistance in obtaining Internet access either through a service provider or through the use of a hot spot device to be provided by the school district.

For the 2021-2022 school year, the district will be open for full days of in-person instruction. On days when the district is scheduled to have an early dismissal in accordance with the adopted school calendar or as a result of an emergency closing due to weather, the minimum instructional day shall be at least four hours long.

Meals

Arrangements will be made to deliver free and reduced price lunches to students' homes in the event that these students are required to be quarantined.
