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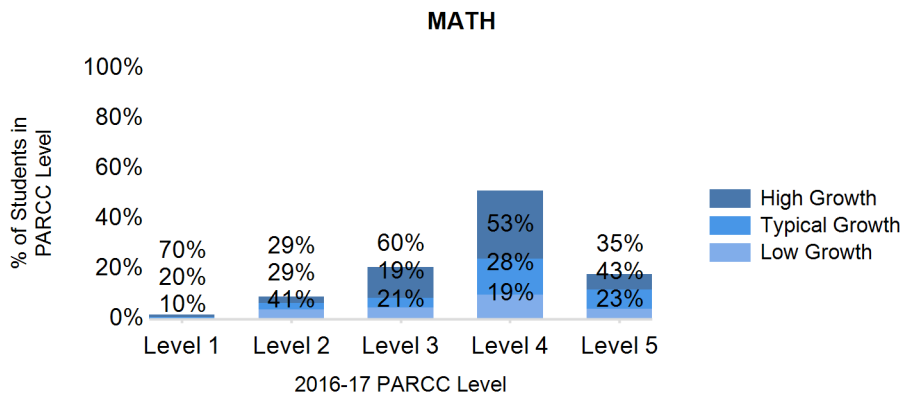
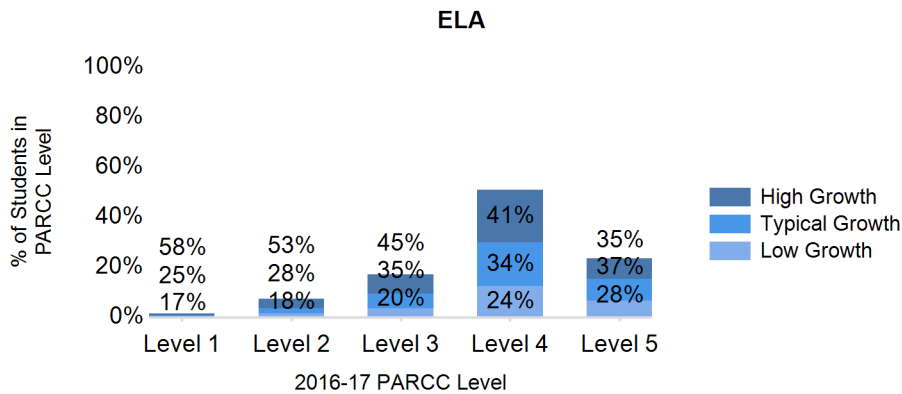

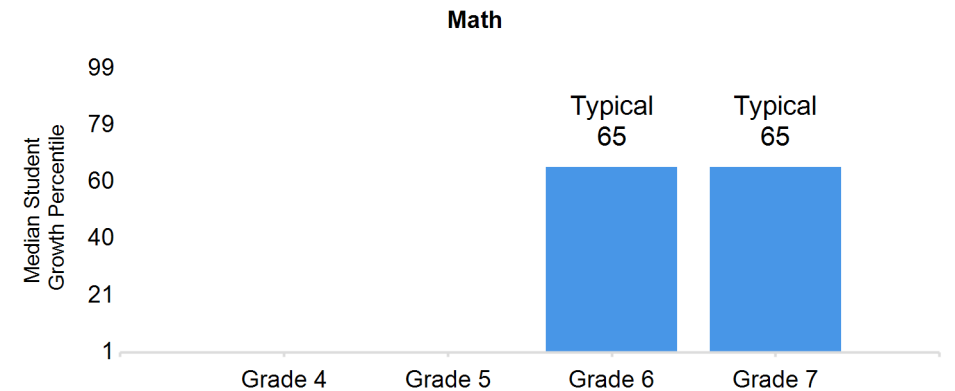
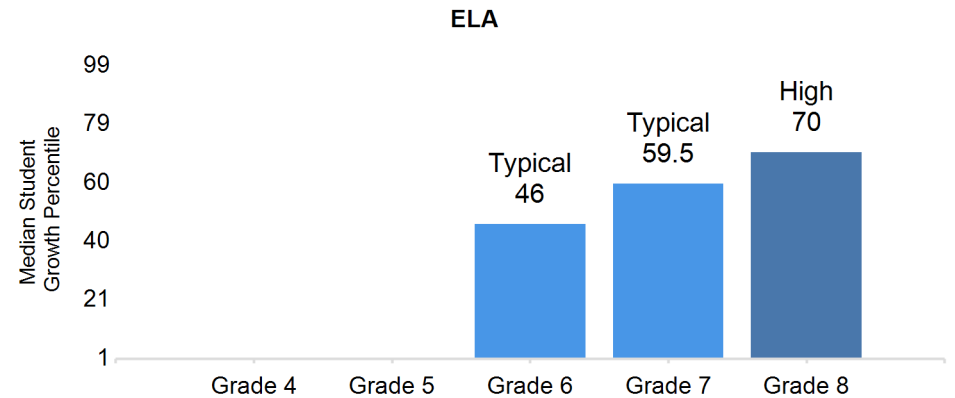
**Student Growth by Performance Level**

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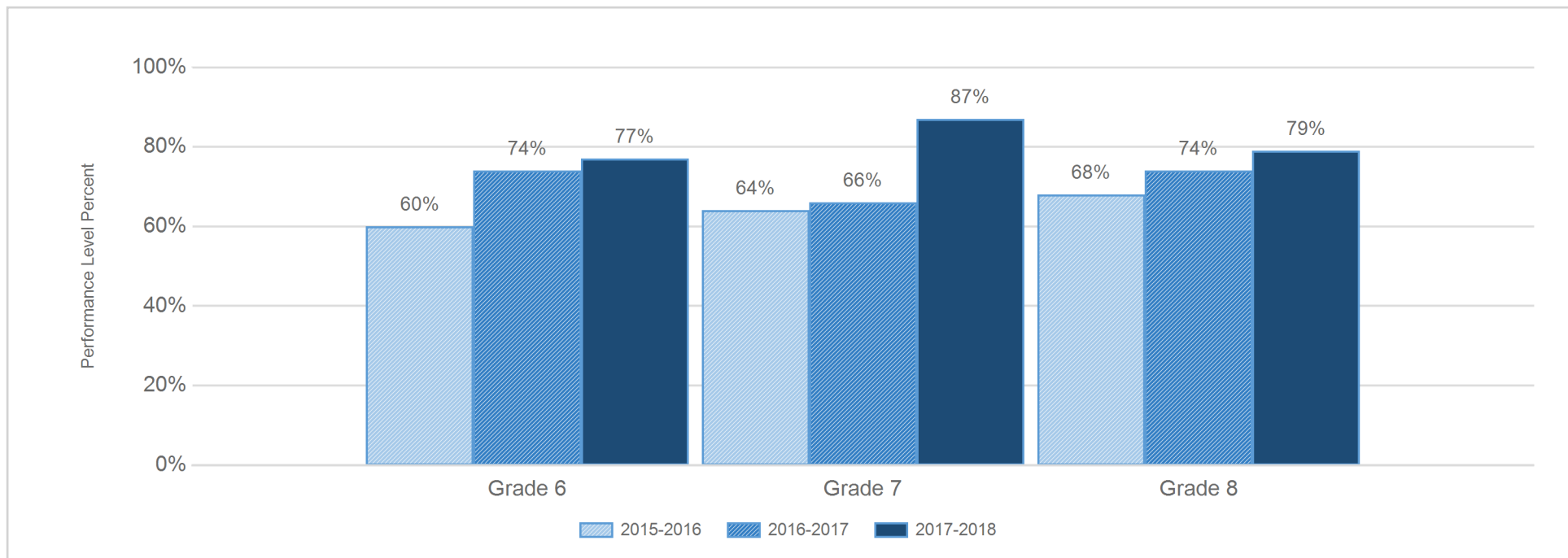

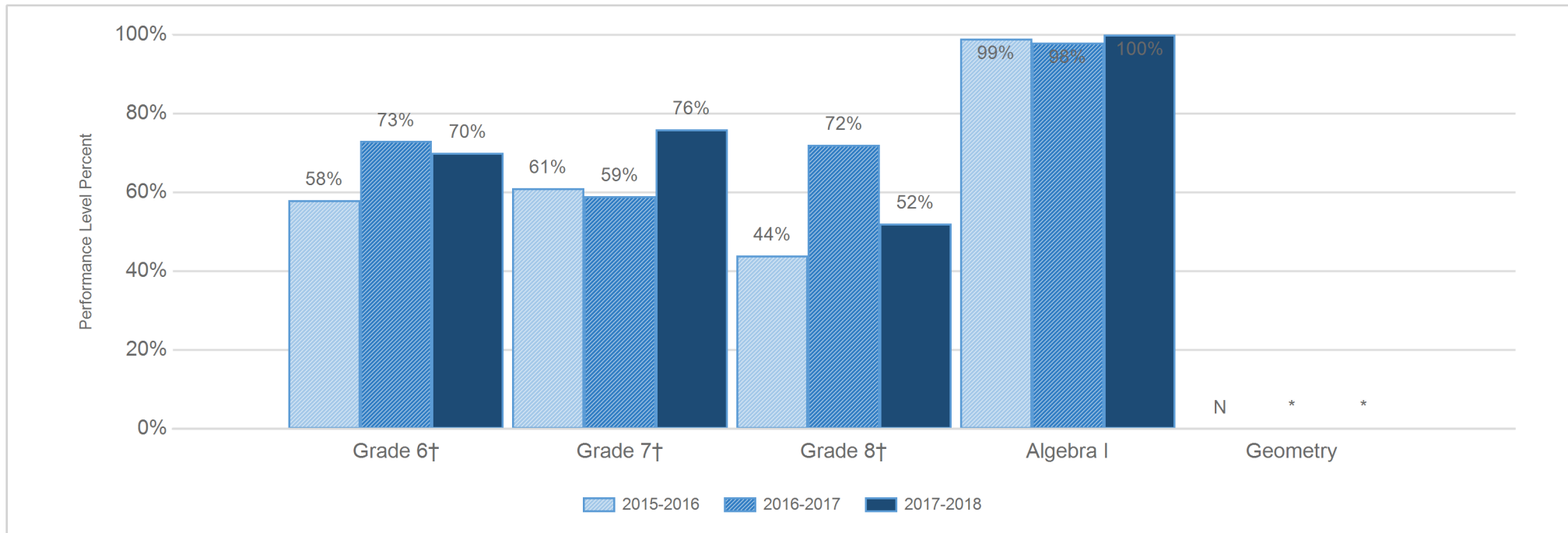

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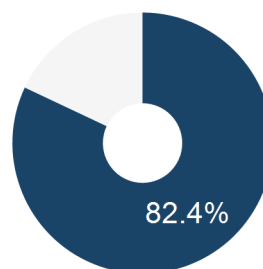

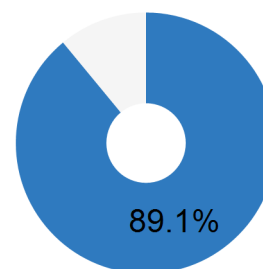

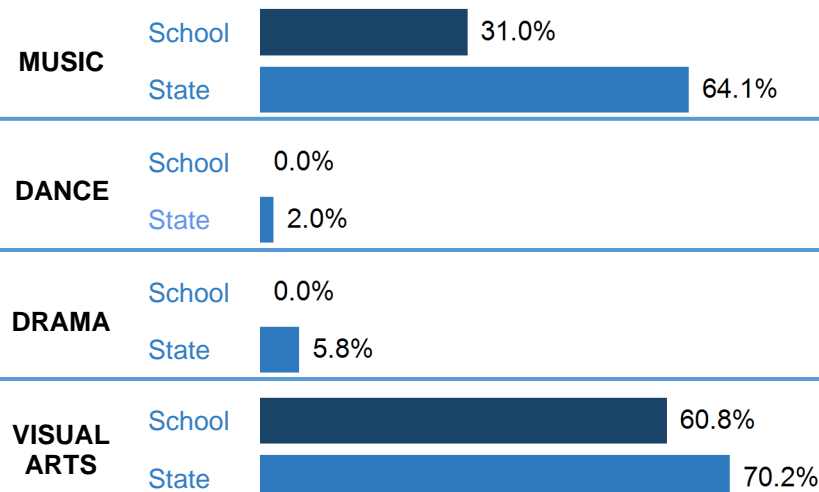

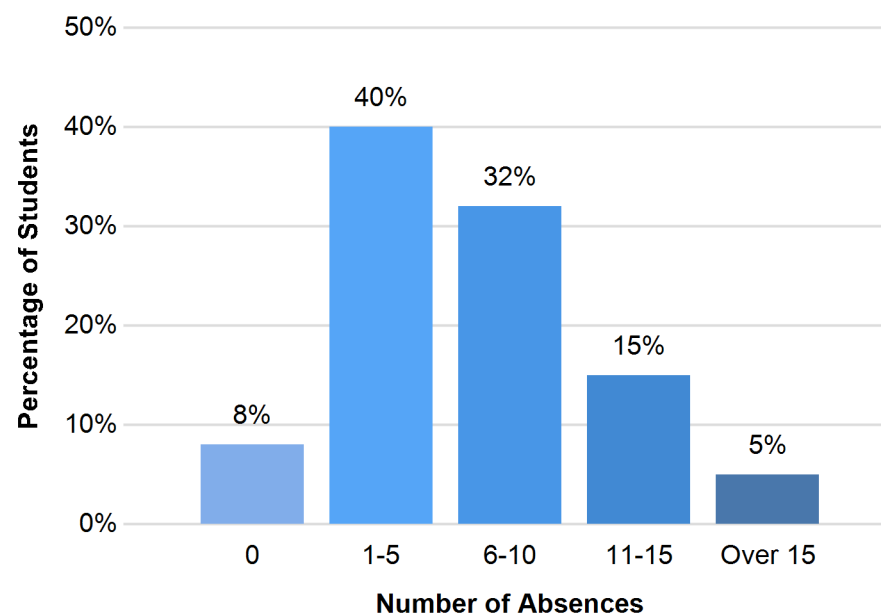

This graph shows the percentage of K-12 students by the number of days they were absent during the school year.





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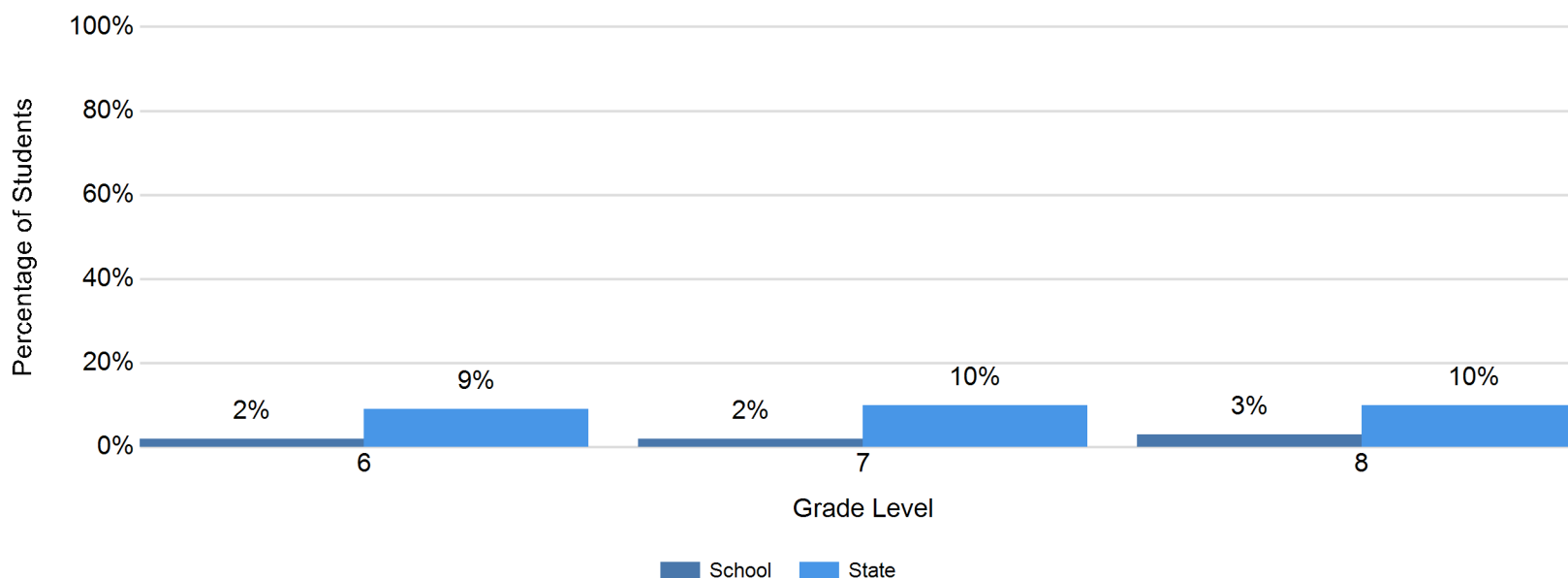
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### Chronic Absenteeism by Grade

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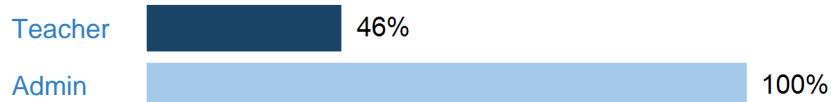
