**Good News & Progress in Our Schools:**

- Hilldale - Hilldale received Honorable Mention for State School of Character.
- Hilldale – The staff and students participated in The Kindness Challenge. The week was filled with daily announcements, quotes, character education lessons and checklist items for the students to complete throughout the week.
- Hilldale – The third grade students have been hard at work practicing conversational Spanish! They recently completed a project where they ask their classmates the time in Spanish after creating their own unique watch in analog time!
- Cedar Hill - The Knitting Club is well underway and the students are excitedly learning how to cast-on and successfully complete the knit stitch.
- Cedar Hill – The students participated in The Great Kindness Challenge; completing as many acts of kindness as they could in one week! This week seamlessly followed our successful “No Name Calling Week”—where students learned about tolerance, acceptance and empathy.
- Cedar Hill – The teachers and staff participated in a free yoga program offered by the Cedar Hill Health & Wellness Committee.
- Cedar Hill - The third grade class of Mr. DiLascio and Ms. Swiatek are participating in the Manga High Math Challenge, with schools competing in the U.S. and Canada. Math skills being challenged are all addition, subtraction, multiplication, division facts; multi-step math problems; reading

bar graphs and pictographs; estimating and rounding. As of Friday, we are ranked in 10th place, with 67 earned gold medals, 23 silver medals and 20 bronze medals. The competition runs until February 15th.

- Valley View - The students in Ms. Caravello and Ms. Streeper's 4<sup>th</sup> grade class have started preparation for their Revolution Rockshow. The students are researching events from the American Revolution and writing/performing songs about them. The best part is- the boys and girls will be creating scenery for their Rockshow videos in dioramas, where they will be recorded and placed into the sets via green screen technology!
- Lazar - Two students, Layla Collado and Mirella Richard from Robert R. Lazar Middle School were selected to participate in the North Jersey Regional Honors Junior High School Chorus and Orchestra. **Section H**

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest.

In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comments, the Board shall set aside a portion of Board meeting, the length of the portion to be determined by the Board, for public comment on any school district issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the school district.

Public participation shall be governed by the following rules.

1. A participant must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface comments by an announcement of his/her name, municipality of residence, and group affiliation, if applicable;
2. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to five minutes' duration;
3. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic until all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard;
4. All statement, questions or inquires shall be directed to the presiding officer and any questions or inquires directed by a participants to another Board member shall be redirected to the presiding officer who shall determine if such statement, question, or inquiry shall be addressed by the presiding officer on behalf of the Board or by the individual Board member;
5. The presiding officer may:
  - Interrupt, warn, and/ or terminate a participant's statement, question or inquiry when it is too lengthy;
  - Interrupt and/or warn a participant when the statement, question or inquiry is abusive, obscene or may be defamatory;
  - Request any person to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum;
  - Request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person prevents or disrupts a meeting with an act that obstructs or interferes with a meeting;
  - Call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting; and
  - Waive these rules when necessary for the protection of privacy or to maintain an orderly operation of the Board Meeting.
