Good News & Progress in Our Schools:

Valley View School - On December 6th, the Valley View community participated in the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's Pajama Day. This is the 3rd year Miss Profeta held the Pajama Day Fundraiser. This year we raised close to \$1,000 to support the children and their families. Valley View has spread so much love and kindness during this holiday season. Thank you to the students, parents, and staff for all your generous support!

Valley View Physical Education teacher Len Saunders has been a spokesperson for the American Heart Association for over a decade. Section H: Public Participation

(For items on the agenda only)

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest.

In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comments, the Board shall set aside a portion of Board meeting, the length of the portion to be determined by the Board, for public comment on any school district issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the school district.

Public participation shall be governed by the following rules.

1. A participant must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface comments by an announcement of his/her name, municipality of residence, and group affiliation, if applicable;
2. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to five minutes' duration;
3. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic until all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard;
4. All statements, questions or inquires shall be directed to the presiding officer and any questions or inquires directed by a participants to another Board member shall be redirected to the presiding officer who shall determine if such statement, question, or inquiry shall be addressed by the presiding officer on behalf of the Board or by the individual Board member;
5. The presiding officer may:
 - Interrupt, warn, and/ or terminate a participant's statement, question or inquiry when it is too lengthy;
 - Interrupt and/or warn a participant when the statement, question or inquiry is abusive, obscene or may be defamatory;
 - Request any person to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum;
 - Request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person prevents or disrupts a meeting with an act that obstructs or interferes with a meeting;
 - Call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting; and
 - Waive these rules when necessary for the protection of privacy or to maintain an orderly operation of the Board Meeting.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Montville Township Board of Education does hereby affirm the Superintendent’s recommendation on Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying regarding the HIB report dated November 28, 2019 through December 13, 2019.

J.3 Authorize Replacement in the School Employees’ Prescription Plan

RESOLVED, that the Montville Township Board of Education agrees to terminate its participation in the Prescription Drug Plan with Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of NJ, at the end of the day on January 31, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of Brown & Brown Benefit Advisors, that the Montville Township Board of Education, accept the proposal, dated November 4, 2019, from Benecard, for a contract to provide Prescription Drug Plan insurance coverage for the district, effective February 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this audit has been completed and the C.A.F.R. will be filed with the State Department of Education and submitted to the Montville Township Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the auditor has conducted exit conferences with the administration and publicly for the full board and the public at the meeting held on December 17, 2019.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Montville Township Board of Education accept the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (C.A.F.R.) for the period ended June 30, 2019 and notes no recommendations were made as a result of this audit; therefore, no Corrective Action Plan will be submitted by the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary. K.8: Revision to Energy Savings Plan: Roof Improvements

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the Township of Montville in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Board" when referring to the governing body and the "School District" when referring to the territorial boundaries governed thereby) is undertaking an energy savings plan (the "ESP") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6; and

WHEREAS, the Board appointed Honeywell International ("Honeywell") to develop the ESP; and

WHEREAS, Honeywell developed an energy savings plan based upon a scope of projects including individual energy conservation measures ("ECM's") which ECM's included the installation of rooftop solar panels to be installed pursuant to a power purchase agreement (the "PPA") at several schools including Cedar Hill Elementary School, Woodmont Elementary School and the High School; and

WHEREAS, such energy savings plan was submitted to and approved by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities; and

WHEREAS, after review of the energy savings plan prepared by Honeywell, the Board approved a plan which did include the PPA but which did not specifically include roof improvements at Cedar Hill Elementary School, Woodmont Elementary School and the High School (the "Roof Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, it is advisable, given the age of the roofs at Cedar Hill Elementary School, Woodmont Elementary School and the High School, that such Roof Improvements be included in the ESP in light of the PPA and that such Roof Improvements be undertaken in conjunction with the PPA; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires that such Roof Improvements be undertaken to the extent that the savings generated from the ESP, including savings from the PPA, will be sufficient to cover the cost of the ECM's including the Roof Improvements; and

WHEREAS, in order to undertake the Roof Improvements as part of the ESP, the Board seeks to (i) revise the ESP to include the Roof Improvements as an ECM and (ii) authorize other actions in connection with the undertaking of the Roof Improvements.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

- SECTION 1. The Board hereby approves and adopts a revised ESP to include the Roof Improvements. The ESP, as revised, shall be posted on the School District's website in accordance with law.
- SECTION 2. The School District's Long Range Facilities Plan is amended to reflect the Roof Improvements and such amendment shall be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Education.
- SECTION 3. Honeywell and the School District's Architect are hereby authorized and directed to submit the Roof Improvements to the New Jersey Department of Education as "Other Capital Projects".
- SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
